Adoption Navigation Services

Northern Rivers' Adoption Navigation Services helps families formed through adoption and guardianship find necessary resources for the variety of issues and needs that arise after finalization.

Trained professionals support adoptive and post-guardianship families, while empowering them for growth and enabling positive outcomes for all involved.





- A helpline (518.426.2888) for information and referral services.
- Connection to a network of traumasensitive practitioners and agencies in the region that provide a variety of services to families who have adopted or have post-guardianship agreements.
- The opportunity to access extensive resources, support groups, adoptionfocused parent training, clinical support, emotional support, and direction to help families navigate the complexities of adoption, and postguardianship arrangements.
- A team of trauma-knowledgeable professionals with an understanding of children's crises and the importance of permanency.

Who Is Eligible?

Anyone who has an adopted child younger than age 21 is eligible to use this free service, as well as families who have legal guardianship or a kinGAP agreement for a child younger than age 21.

The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) has provided funding for this grant.
